
Feedlots are an important part of the cattle traceability chain. Amendments to the Part XV Health of Animals Regulations (Identification and Traceability) require feedlots to report animals arriving on their premises.

WHY GET STARTED WITH DAIRYTRACE?

DairyTrace is Canada's traceability program for all calves born on dairy farms, which are identified with white tags. This infosheet provides a quick overview of how DairyTrace supports feedlots to meet new traceability requirements for dairy animals.

REPORTING TRACEABILITY EVENTS

There are two options for feedlots to report traceability events: DairyTrace and the Canadian Cattle Identification Agency (CCIA). Feedlots that are finishing animals with white DairyTrace tags are required to have an account in both databases. There are options available to assist with reporting to either database, which are shown below for DairyTrace.

The most complete reporting of a move-in event includes:

1. PID of departure (last stop before arrival)
2. PID of the feedlot
3. Animal ID# (15 digits)
4. License plate and province of the truck or trailer delivering the animal



DAIRYTRACE ROLE IN TRACEABILITY

Traceability data collected by DairyTrace is stored for emergency management purposes such as responding to disease outbreaks.

This information is required by the Federal Government as Part XV of the Health of Animals Regulations for cattle in Canada under the direction of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA).
